Robbery

On February 21, 2022, at approximately 4:00 pm, officers were dispatched to 4000 Baldwin Road for an armed robbery.

The investigation revealed that a 77-year-old female from Lake Orion, was walking out the exterior doors of a store located at the Great Lakes Crossing Mall when the suspect approached her. The subject placed a gun to the victim's head and grabbed a bag from her arms. The subject fled the scene toward I-75. On February 22, 2022, Auburn Hills detectives located the subject, and he was taken into custody.

The Oakland County Prosecutor's Office charged the subject with Armed Robbery.

Larceny from Vehicle

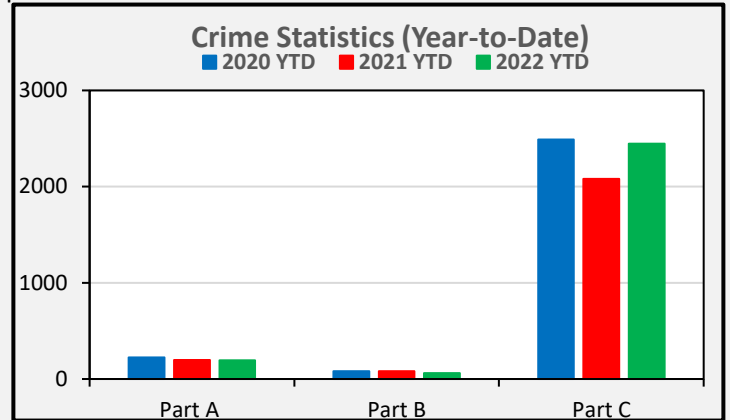
On February 25, 2022, at approximately 04:00 am, officers were dispatched to the area of Patrick Henry Drive for two males breaking into vehicles.

The investigation revealed that the subjects broke into several vehicles. The subjects were located and arrested.

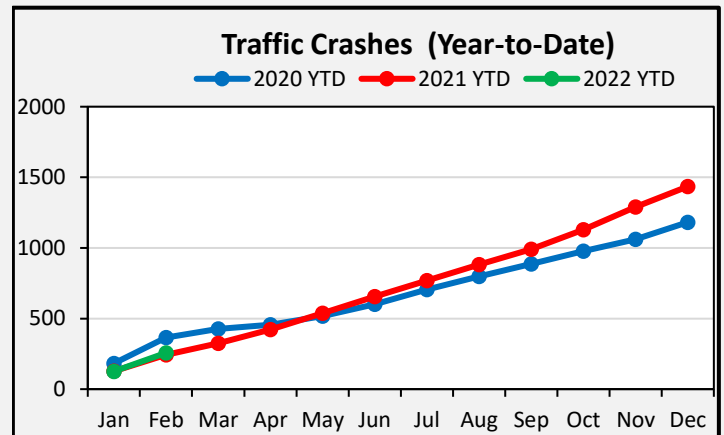
The Oakland County Prosecutor's Office charged the subjects with one count of Larceny From an Automobile, three counts of Attempt Unlawful Driving Away of an Automobile, and two counts of Breaking and Entering – Damage to Vehicle.

Crime and Service Statistics

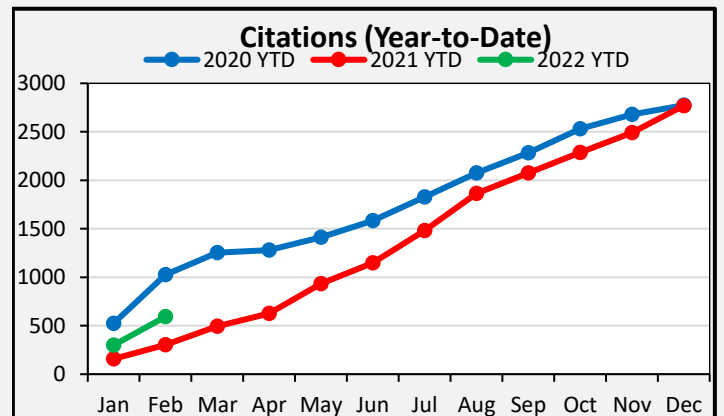
We continually strategize our responses and make the best use of the tools and personnel we have to produce the best possible outcomes.



Year to date we have experienced a -3.02% decrease in Part A incidents (more serious offenses), a -25.61% decrease in Part B incidents (non-violent misdemeanors), and an 17.49% increase in Part C incidents (misdemeanor and service-related incidents) compared to 2021.



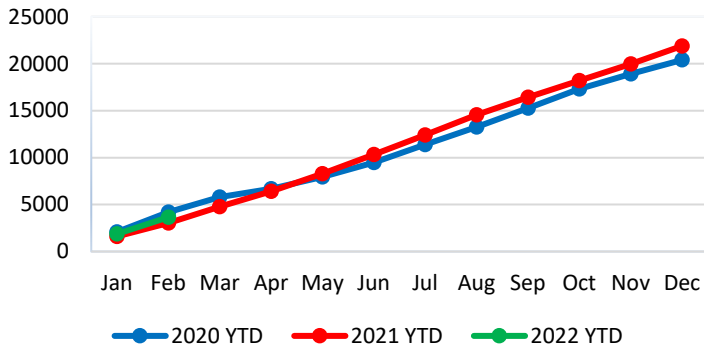
During February, we handled 131 crashes. Year to date we have experienced an 5.76% increase in traffic crashes compared to 2021.



Officers issued 593 citations in February 2022. Year to date we have experienced an 96% increase in citations issued compared to 2021.

Calls for Service

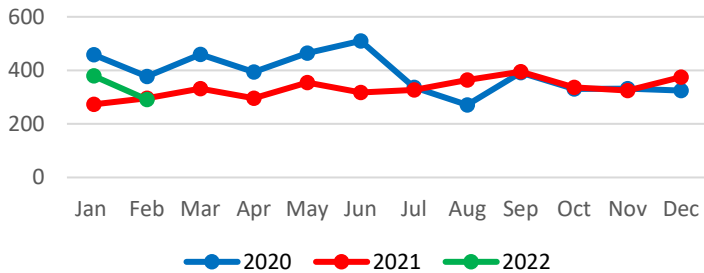
Calls for Service (Year-to-Date)



Officers handled 1785 calls for service during February. Year to date the department has handled 3652 calls for service, which is an 20.57% increase compared to 2021.

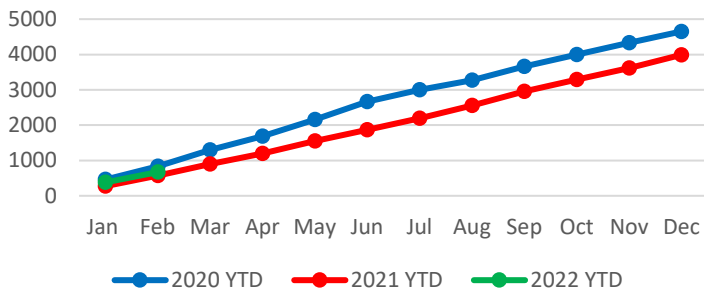
Time in Neighborhoods

Cumulative Time in Neighborhoods (Year-to-Date)

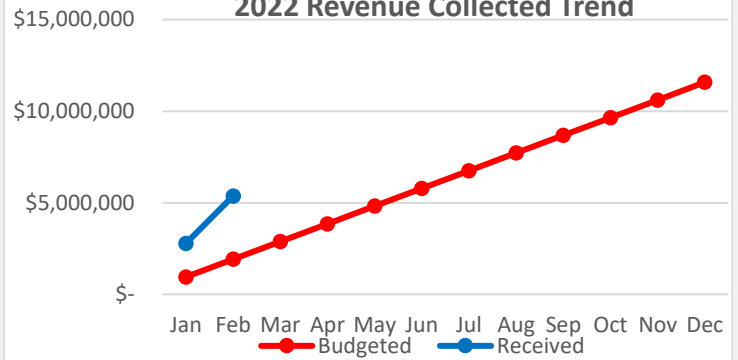


Year to date we have spent 670 hours in our neighborhoods, which is an 17.77% increase compared to 2021.

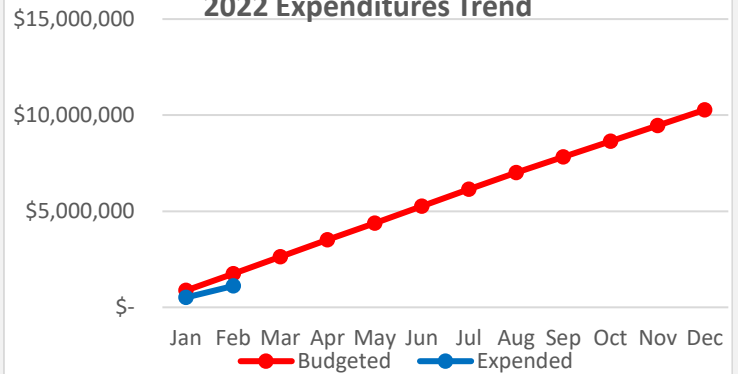
We continually analyze our department expenditures to ensure we remain within our approved budget, while delivering the best possible service to our community.

During February, we received \$2,586,669 in revenue. Year to date we have received \$5,370,837.

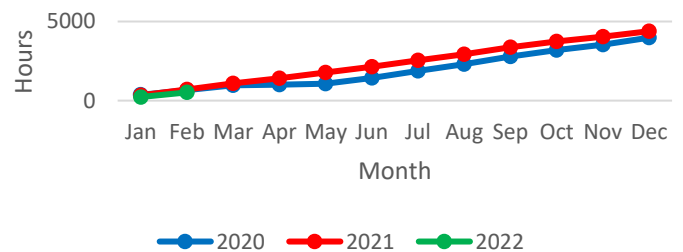
2022 Expenditures Trend



During February, we expended \$597,776. Year to date we have expended \$1,109,489 or 10% of our approved budget. We are currently \$642,298 under budget at the end of February 2022.
