

Impersonating a Police Officer Investigation

On Tuesday, September 24, 2019 at 10:30 am an officer from the Auburn Hills Police Department stopped a vehicle on northbound I-75 near Lapeer Rd. for improper window tint and suspicious LED lights in the windows. The driver, a 37 year old man from Flat Rock, Michigan was operating a silver 2012 Dodge Charger.

During the traffic stop the police officer observed a laptop computer mounted in the vehicle's center console and a loss prevention badge next to it. The driver did not have a driver's license on his person and it was ultimately determined that the driver had a suspended license and numerous traffic related warrants for his arrest. The driver was arrested for driving on a suspended license.

A search of the vehicle revealed a black Glock style BB gun, bullet proof style vest with police patches on it, and OC/pepper spray. On the front of the vest there was a patch which states, "Michigan Police Attorney General". A search warrant was obtained for the vehicle and it was seized by the Auburn Hills Police Department. Further inspection of the vehicle determined that it had 360 degree red and blue lights and a functioning siren on the vehicle.



The Auburn Hills Police wish to share this information with the public and determine if anyone has had any encounters with this person on the road. The case is currently under investigation by the Auburn Hills Police Department Investigations Division.
