### Attempt Home Invasion

On January 22, 2020, at 02:59 am, officers from the Auburn Hills Police Department responded to the area of 660 Lake Village Boulevard for a disturbance call.

Officers were able to locate the responsible individual near 660 Lake Village Boulevard. The investigation revealed that the individual attempted to break into an apartment by kicking in the front door. The suspect was arrested and lodged at the Oakland County Jail. The suspect was ultimately charged with attempted Home Invasion 1<sup>st</sup> Degree.

## Suspect Charged After Installing Hidden Camera

On January 19, 2020, at 4:43 pm, officers were dispatched to the Target store located at 650 Brown Road for a person who had just installed a hidden camera in one of the fitting rooms. Officers with the help of loss prevention staff made contact with the suspect at the exit to the store.

The investigation revealed that the suspect entered the store, selected some clothing, and entered into one of the fitting rooms. Once the suspect left the fitting room, loss prevention staff discovered that a camera had been installed. The suspect was found to be in possession of other recording devices, similar to what was placed in the fitting room.

Investigators from Auburn Hills, with the assistance of the Oakland County Sheriff's Office executed a search warrant at the suspect's residence in Orion Township.

The suspect, Nathan Howard Wilson, a 46 year old man from Orion Township, Michigan was arrested and lodged at the Oakland County Jail. He was ultimately charged with Surveilling an Unclothed Person 2<sup>nd</sup> offense (5 year felony), Capturing/Distributing Image of Unclothed Person (5 year felony), Eavesdropping – Installing/Using Device (2 year felony), and two counts of using a Computer to Commit a Crime (4-10 year felony).

He was arraigned at the 52/3 District Court on January 22, 2020, and bond was set at \$50,000.00 cash.

## Financial Transaction Device

On January 15, 2020, at 11:22 pm officers responded to the Mobil gas station located on Baldwin Road. A domestic violence incident started in Holly and continued into Auburn Hills. Once inside the gas station the suspect attempted to carry the female victim outside. The gas station clerk intervened to stop the threat and the suspect released the victim.

The suspect fled the gas station with the victim's bankcard. With the assistance of the Oakland County Sheriff's Office, the suspect was arrested at a residence in Pontiac. The suspect was lodged at the Oakland County Jail. The suspect was charged with FTD – Financial Transaction Device/Stealing/Retaining without consent, Domestic Violence, and Driving While License Suspended 2<sup>nd</sup> or Subsequent Offense.

## Larceny in a Building

On January 25, 2020, at 3:09pm, Officer Dearing-Manning responded to the Great Lakes Crossing Mall for a larceny report. The victim's wallet was taken from a kiosk located within the Great Lakes Crossing Mall.

Officer Dearing-Manning reviewed video surveillance of the incident. The investigation revealed that the suspect walked up to the kiosk and took the victim's wallet. The suspect took the contents from the wallet and it discarded the wallet in a restroom.

Officer Dearing-Manning located the suspect inside of the Great Lakes Crossing Mall near an entrance to a store. The suspect admitted to taking the victim's credit cards from the wallet. The suspect was arrested and lodged at the Oakland County Jail. The suspect was charged with Larceny in a Building and FTD – Financial Transaction Device/Stealing/Retaining without consent.

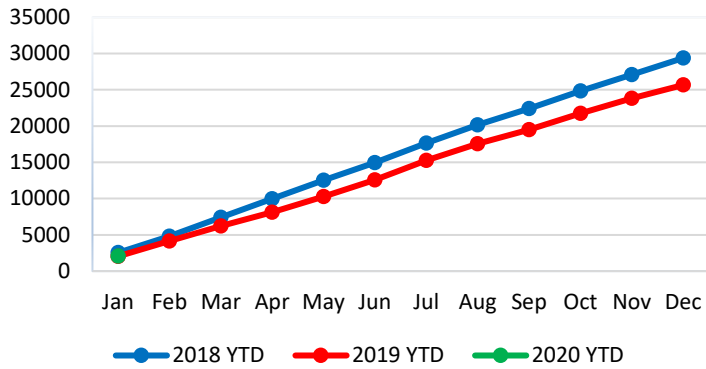
## Assist Other Departments

## Calls for Service

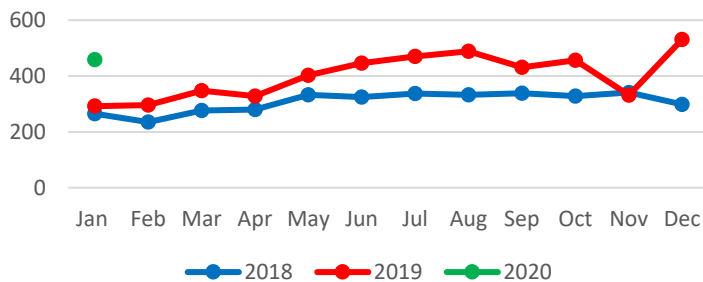
### Calls for Service



Officers handled 2085 calls for service during the month of January. Year to date, the department has experienced a 2.01% increase compared to 2019 YTD.

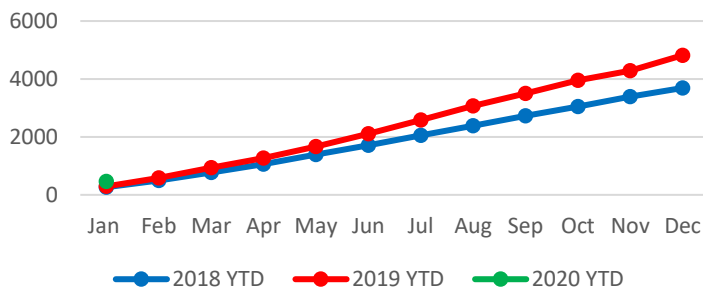
## Time in Neighborhoods

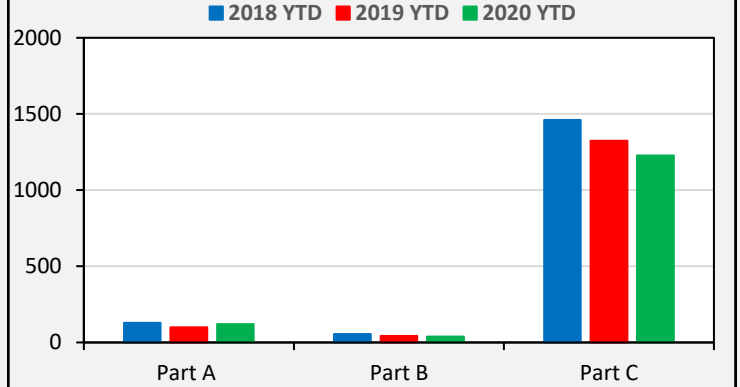
### Cumulative Time in Neighborhoods (Year to Date)



## Crime and Service Statistics

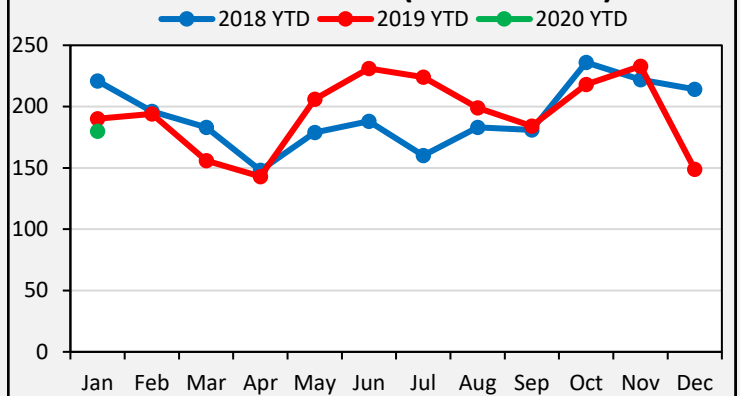
We continually strategize our responses and make the best use of the tools and personnel we have to produce the best possible outcomes.

### Crime Statistics (Year to Date)



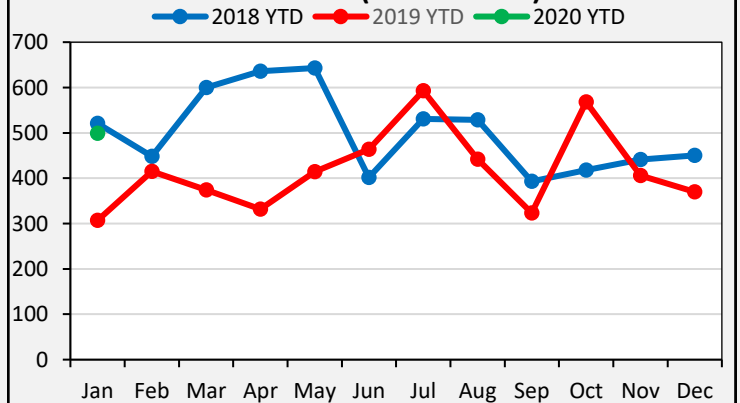
Year to date the department has a 22.22% increase in our Part A incidents (more serious offenses), -7.14% decrease in our Part B incidents (non-violent misdemeanors), and a -7.40% decrease in Part C incidents (misdemeanor and service related incidents) compared to year to date 2019.

### Traffic Crashes (Year to Date)



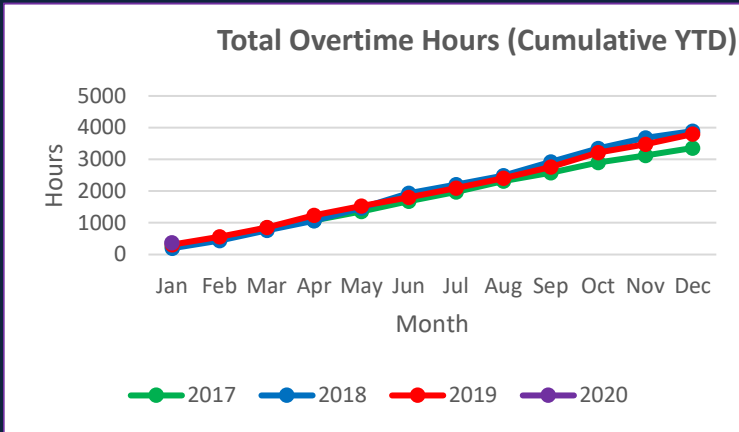
During the month of January, we handled 180 crashes. Year to date the department has experienced a -5.26% decrease in traffic crashes compared to 2019.

Officers issued 499 citations in January 2020. Year to date the department has experienced a 62.54% increase in citations issued compared to 2019.

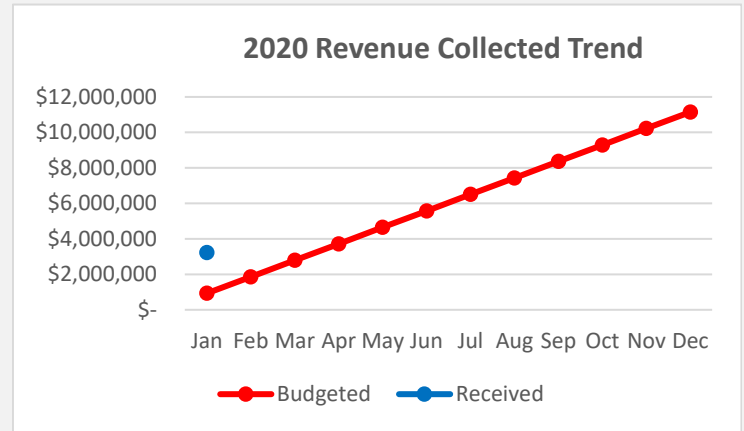
## Department Overtime



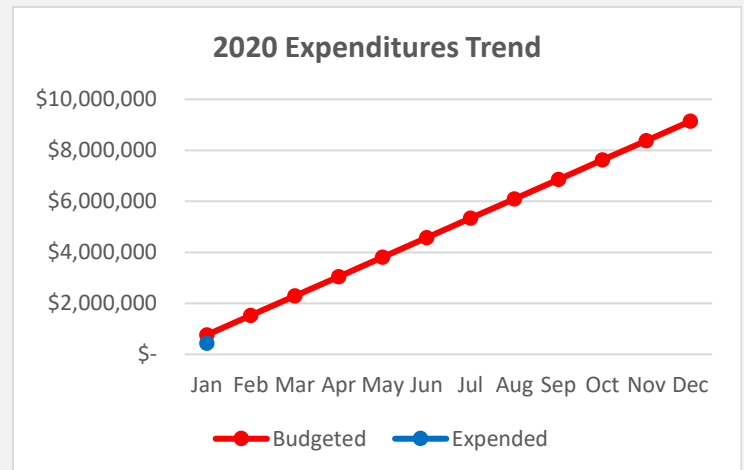
Officers worked at total of 365 hours of overtime in the month of January. This is a cumulative year to date increase in overtime of 51.75 hours compared to this same time last year.
