Monthly Report: May 2022

Awards

The week of May 16, 2022 was National Police Week. The police department honored those lost with a first annual wreath presentation & commemoration ceremony at the police department. Additionally, several Auburn Hills Officers received awards for outstanding service over the past year.



New Officer

On May 2, 2022, Officer Mariah Eckel was sworn in as our newest officer. Officer Eckel has prior law enforcement and fire service experience and comes highly recommended.



Memorial Day Parade

On May 31, Honor Guard Officers Oliver, Anderson, Dearing-Manning, and Buechner were honored to march in the city's annual Memorial Day Parade along with Sergeant Brasil.



Retail Fraud

On May 3, Officer Jackson conducted a traffic stop for a vehicle with tinted windows on I75 near Joslyn Road. Officer Jackson recognized the driver as a suspect he saw on video in a retail fraud, for which he had taken a report at Home Depot on April 27. The suspect, a 44-year-old male from Pontiac, had taken \$600 in merchandise during that incident. The suspect was positively identified as a result of this traffic stop. Charges have been submitted to the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office and are pending.

Cocaine Possession

On May 3, Officer Anderson stopped a vehicle on Walton near Lapeer Road for a traffic offense. The passenger, a 45-year-old male from Waterford, was arrested for an outstanding warrant. Pills were found on his person which later tested positive as pressed crack cocaine. The driver, a 42-year-old female from Lake Orion, was also arrested after officers located codeine inside her vehicle. Charges have been submitted to the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office and are pending lab results.

Naloxone Save

On May 14, Officers Oliver and Jennings were dispatched to the area of Squirrel Road north of South Boulevard for a report of a male who was lying on the ground and unresponsive. He was later identified as a 29-year-old male from Davisburg. After giving him one dose of Narcan, the male became alert. He was treated and released by AHFD.

Hit and Run Crash

On May 21, Officer Jackson was dispatched to Sheffield Estates Mobile Home Park for a report of a vehicle that had left the roadway and struck several parked vehicles. The responsible driver had abandoned his vehicle and left the area on foot.

There were three vehicles that had been struck and all had heavy damage.

Officer Jackson located the suspected driver walking on Opdyke Road. The driver attempted to flee from Officer Jackson and was arrested. He was identified as a 31-year-old male from Waterford. The driver said he had been drinking and was suicidal; he was transported to a medical facility for mental evaluation. He was issued a citation for driving while impaired, driving with a suspended license, and for hit and run.

Felonious Assault

On May 31, a 16-year-old resident of Auburn Hills came into the police department lobby with her mother to report that she had been pistol whipped by her 18-year-old brother.

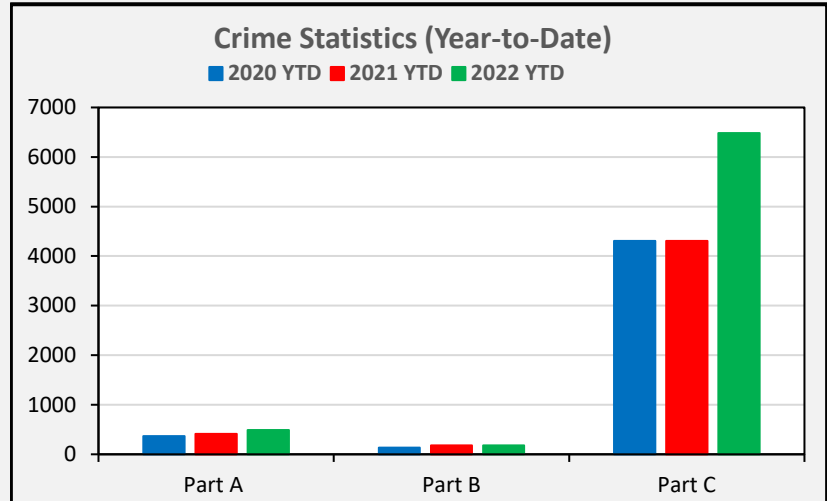
The victim reported that her brother had become upset with her because he thought that she had stolen his vape. The suspect struck the victim in the face with what the victim believed to be the barrel of a pistol. The victim's mother then removed the victim from the home, took the pistol, and drove to the police department. The suspect was later arrested walking in the area of his residence.

The pistol used in the assault was a noisemaker gun. The victim had minor injuries to her face and neck.

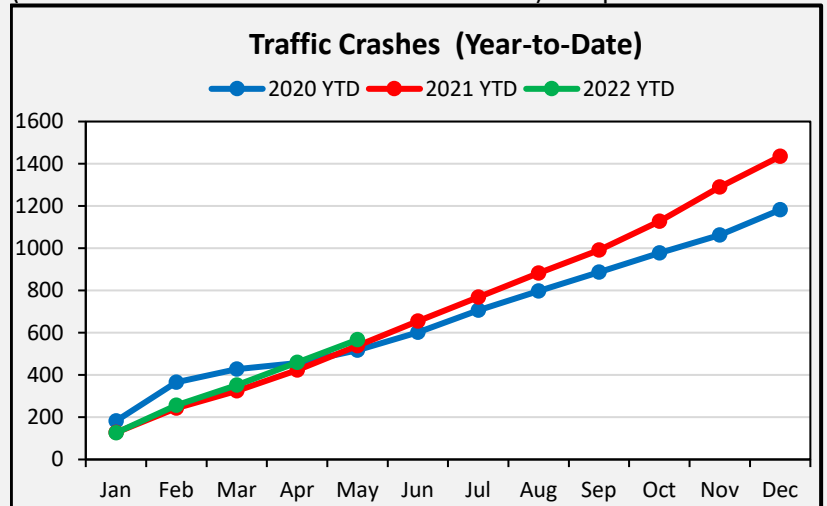
The Oakland County Prosecutor's Office authorized charges for the suspect for Felonious Assault and Domestic Violence.

Crime and Service Statistics

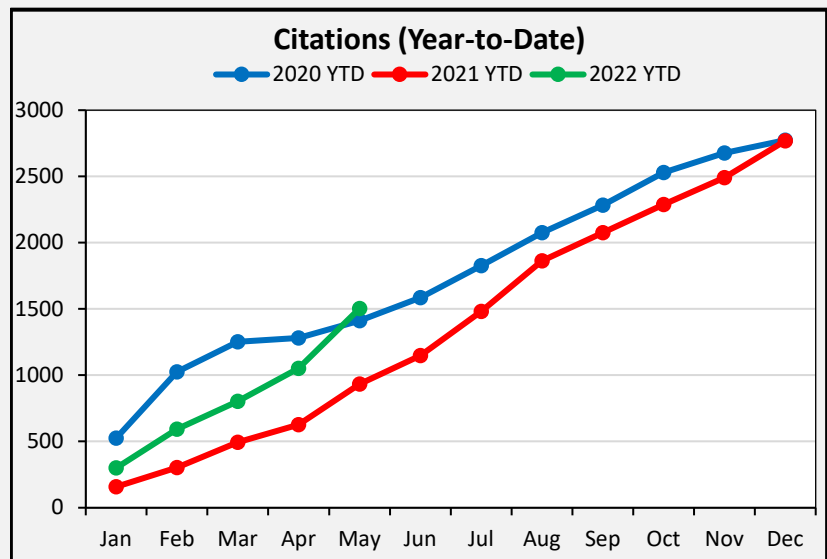
We continually strategize our responses and make the best use of the tools and personnel we have to produce the best possible outcomes.



Year to date we have experienced a 17% increase in Part A incidents (more serious offenses), a 1.6% decrease in Part B incidents (non-violent misdemeanors), and a 50% increase in Part C incidents (misdemeanor and service-related incidents) compared to 2021.



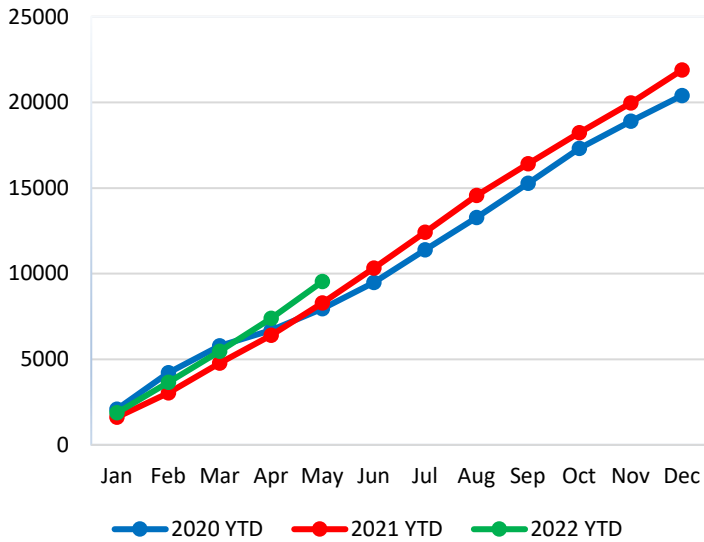
During May, we handled 108 crashes. Year to date we have experienced a 5.3% increase in traffic crashes compared to 2021.



Officers issued 452 citations in May 2022. Year to date we have experienced a 61% increase in citations issued compared to 2021.

Calls for Service

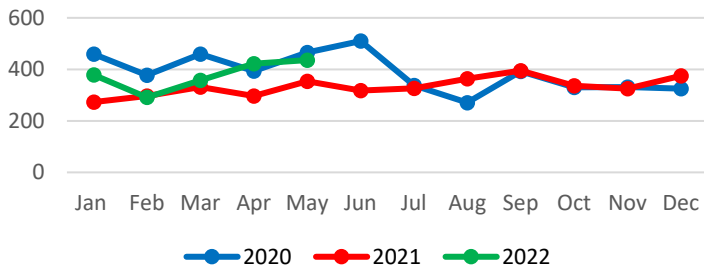
Calls for Service (Year-to-Date)



Officers handled 2150 calls for service during May. Year to date the department has handled 9537 calls for service, which is a 15% increase compared to 2021.

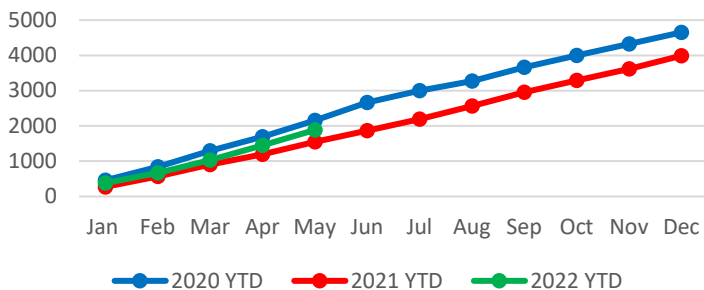
Time in Neighborhoods

Cumulative Time in Neighborhoods (Year-to-Date)

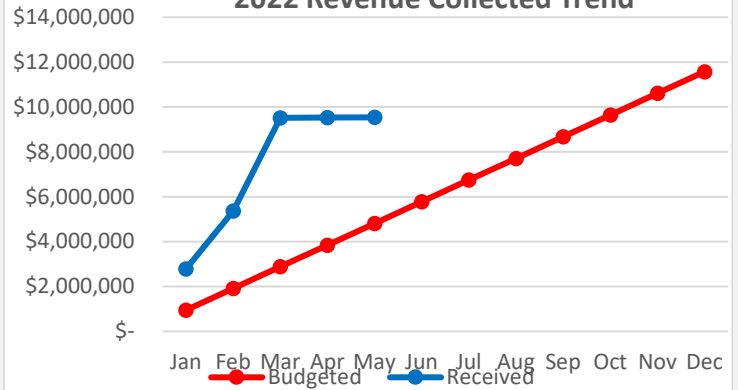


Year to date we have spent 1885 hours in our neighborhoods, which is a 21% increase compared to 2021.

Financial Reports

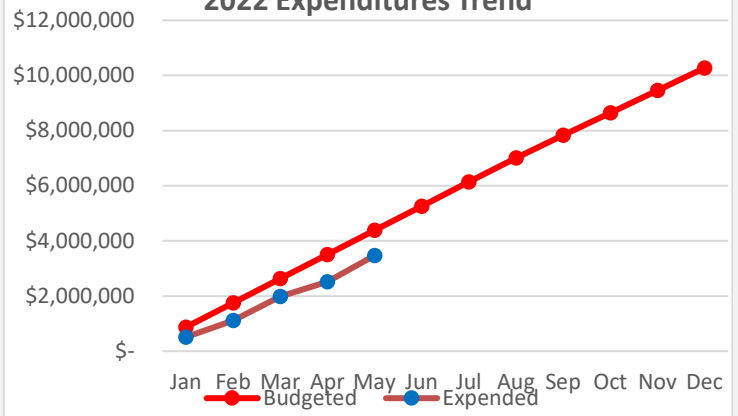
We continually analyze our department expenditures to ensure we remain within our approved budget, while delivering the best possible service to our community.

During May, we received \$13,430 in revenue. Year to date we have received \$9,539,863.

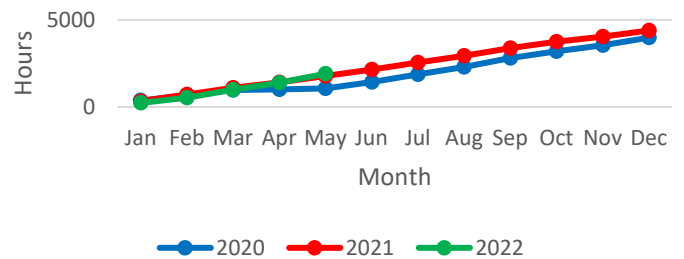
2022 Expenditures Trend



During May, we expended \$946,178. Year to date we have expended \$3,470,269 or 32% of our approved budget. We are currently \$913,230 under budget as of the end of May 2022.

Officers worked a total of 506 hours of overtime in May. This is a cumulative year to date increase in overtime of 130 hours compared to this same time last year.
