### Possession of Firearms and Cocaine

On November 1st, Officers Tappo and Oliver conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for a broken taillight. The driver, a 52-year-old male from Auburn Hills, was subsequently arrested for not having a driver's license. During a search of the vehicle, officers found three loaded pistols and cocaine. The Oakland County Prosecutor's Office authorized charges for Carrying Concealed Weapons and Cocaine Possession, both felony charges.

### Narcan Save

On November 6th, Officer Jennings was dispatched to the Rodeway Inn for a report of a female who was unconscious, believed to be overdosing on crack cocaine. When he arrived, the female had a faint pulse. Officer Jennings administered two doses of Naloxone and the female regained consciousness.

## Possession of Methamphetamine

On November 14th, Officer Ferriter was dispatched to Featherstone Road near the hotels for a report of a male walking through the parking lots and looking into car windows. They located the male, a 38-year-old from Clarkston, and he was placed under arrest for an outstanding warrant.

The male was in possession of prescription medication and credit cards that belonged to his girlfriend, who was staying at the Staybridge Hotel on Opdyke Road. Officer Ferriter went to the hotel to return these items to her. When he arrived, he found her unconscious on the floor of her hotel room with baggies of methamphetamine on the floor. After she regained consciousness, she was placed under arrest for possession of methamphetamine. The Oakland County Prosecutor's Office denied charges.

## Flock Notification

On November 16th, Sergeant Peters responded to a notification from the Flock camera system for a stolen vehicle. The vehicle was a U-Haul and left the city into Pontiac before Auburn Hills officers were able to locate it. Due to the vehicle being in Pontiac, we notified Oakland County Sheriff's Office and they located the vehicle. They initiated a traffic stop in Pontiac and two occupants were taken into custody. The U-Haul contained appliances and other electronics which were possibly stolen during area burglaries.

## Flock Notification

On November 17th, Sergeant Peters responded to a notification on the Flock camera system about a stolen license plate on a vehicle that was entering the city. The license plate had been reported stolen by the Oakland County Sheriff's Office. Sergeant Peters located the vehicle and initiated a traffic stop. The driver, a 30-year-old male from Orion Township, was turned over to deputies from the Oakland County Sheriff's Office for further investigation.

## Possession of Narcotics

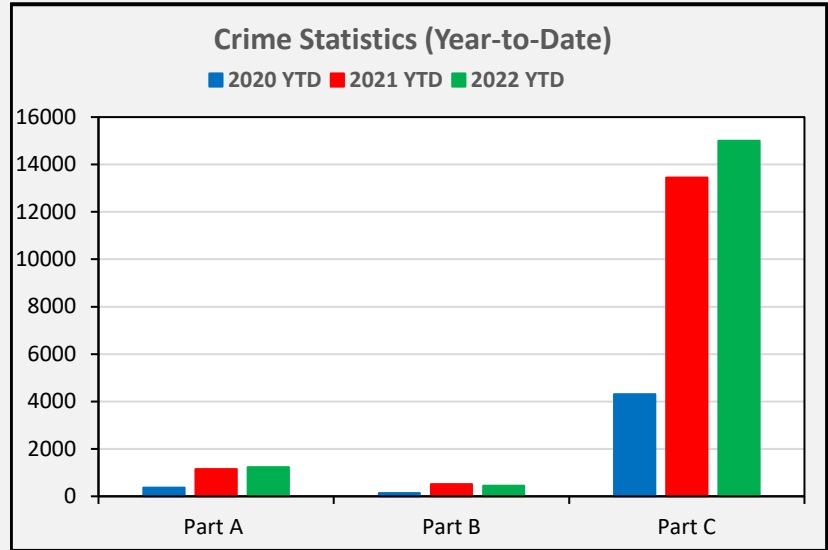
On November 26th, Officer O'Connell made a traffic stop for an expired license plate. The driver, a 35-year-old male from Orion, refused to identify himself or provide any documents to officers.

The driver was eventually arrested for an outstanding warrant. When they searched his vehicle, officers found narcotic pills that were not prescribed to the driver.

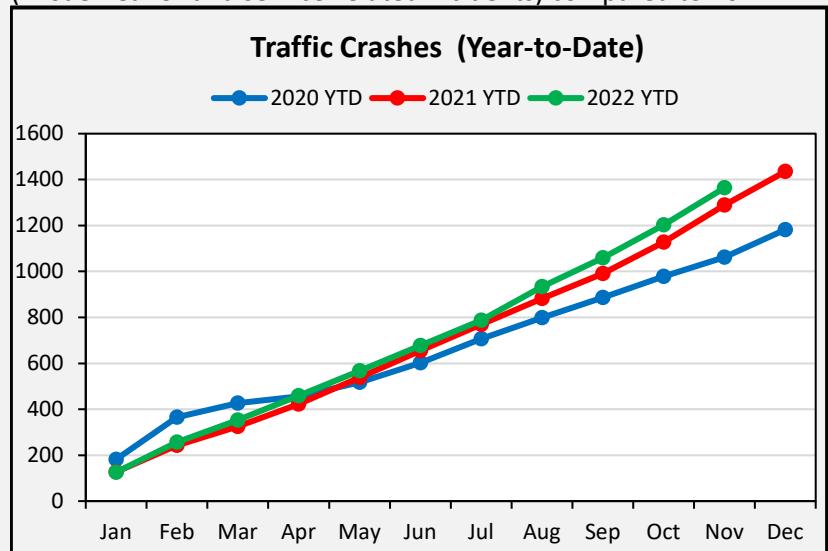
The Oakland County Prosecutor's Office authorized charges for possession of controlled substances and resisting an officer, both felony charges.

## Crime and Service Statistics

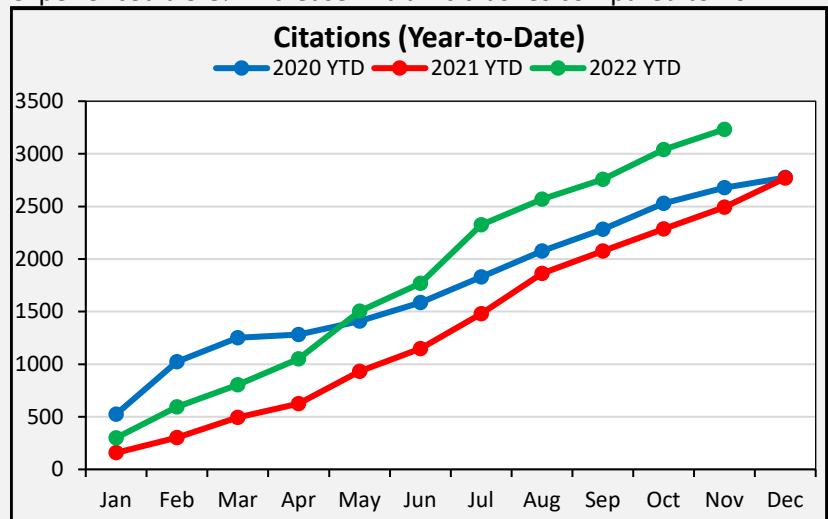
We continually strategize our responses and make the best use of the tools and personnel we have to produce the best possible outcomes.



Year to date we have experienced a 7.7% increase in Part A incidents (more serious offenses), a 14% decrease in Part B incidents (non-violent misdemeanors), and an 11% increase in Part C incidents (misdemeanor and service-related incidents) compared to 2021.



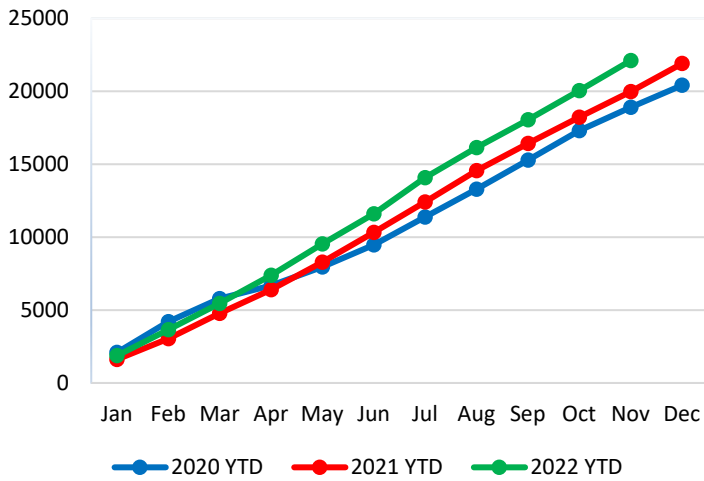
During November, we handled 162 crashes. Year to date we have experienced a 5.8% increase in traffic crashes compared to 2021.



Officers issued 193 citations in November. Year to date we have experienced a 29% increase in citations issued compared to 2021.

## Calls for Service

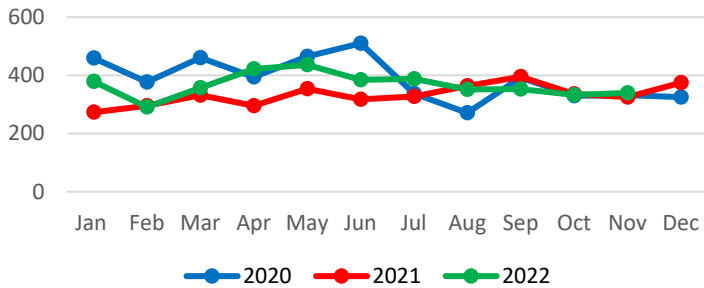
### Calls for Service (Year-to-Date)



Officers handled 2048 calls for service during November. Year to date the department has handled 22,096 calls for service, which is a 10% increase compared to 2021.

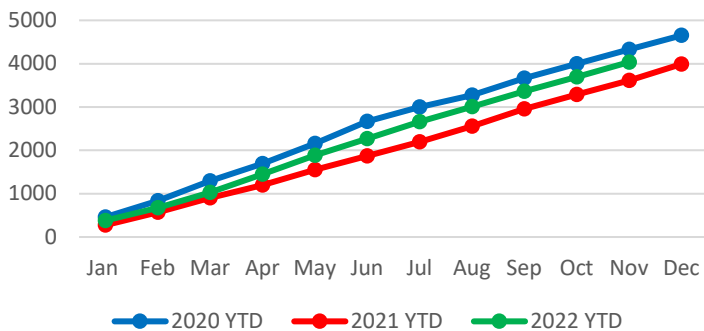
## Time in Neighborhoods

### Cumulative Time in Neighborhoods (Year-to-Date)

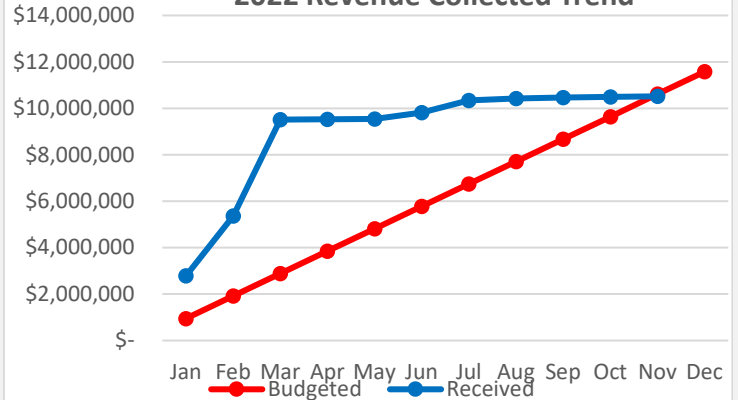


Year to date we have spent 4036 hours in our neighborhoods, which is an 11% increase compared to 2021.

## Financial Reports

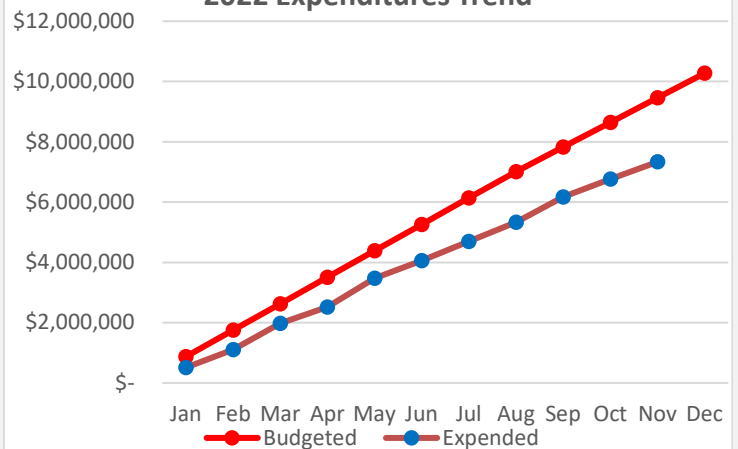
We continually analyze our department expenditures to ensure we remain within our approved budget, while delivering the best possible service to our community.

During November, we received \$47,316 in revenue. Year to date we have received \$10,516,666.

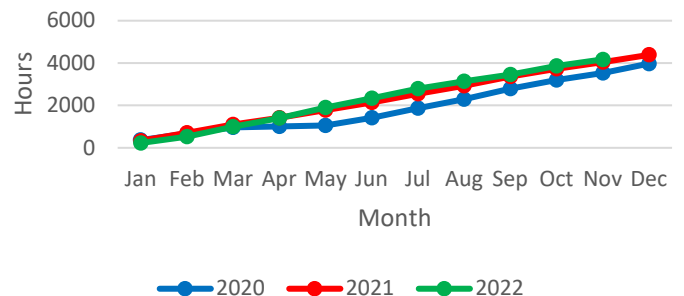
### 2022 Expenditures Trend



During November, we expended \$565,267. Year to date we have expended \$7,334,629 or 67% of our approved budget. We are currently \$2,126,348 under budget as of the end of November 2022.

Officers worked a total of 342 hours of overtime in November. This is a cumulative year to date increase in overtime of 128 hours compared to this same time last year.
