

Suspect Charged with Assault with Intent to Murder

On Saturday, October 26, 2019 at 11:40 pm, personnel from the Auburn Hills Police and Fire Departments were dispatched to a shooting that had just occurred at the Baymont Inn, located at 1294 N. Opdyke Rd. in Auburn Hills. One victim, a 42 year old man from Auburn Hills, was found at the scene with a gunshot wound to his leg. The victim was transported to McLaren Oakland Hospital in Pontiac for treatment of non-life threatening injuries. It was determined at the scene that several rounds were fired from a hand gun and no other persons or property were struck by projectiles.

Investigators were able to positively identify the suspect in this case. This incident was not a random act of violence as the victim and suspect are known to each other. It is suspected that a drug debt precipitated the confrontation and ultimately led to the suspect shooting the victim.

The suspect, London Blake Moses, 29 years old from Detroit, was arrested on Sunday afternoon in Auburn Hills with the assistance of the FBI Oakland County Gang and Violent Crime Task Force. London Moses was formally charged with assault with intent to murder, which carries a maximum possible penalty of life in prison. He was also charged with seven additional charges related to armed robbery, possessing a firearm in the commission of a felony, felony firearm, and felon in possession of ammunition.

On Wednesday, October 30, 2019, Moses was arraigned at 52/3 District Court in front of Magistrate Holt. Bond was set at \$250,000 cash, no 10%. A preliminary exam conference has been scheduled for November 12, 2019 at 1:15 pm in front of Judge Nicholson.

The Auburn Hills Police Department would like to thank the FBI Oakland County Gang and Violent Crime Task Force for their assistance in apprehending the suspect and assisting in this investigation. The task force is comprised of federal, state, county, and local law enforcement officers.
