Lt. Jill McDonnell Graduates from the FBI National Academy

The Auburn Hills Police Department is proud to announce the graduation of Lieutenant Jill McDonnell from the FBI National Academy Program at Quantico, Virginia. Lt. McDonnell successfully completed the 10 week advanced training program as a member of the 257th Session of the Academy.

Two hundred and ten law enforcement officers graduated from the program, consisting of men and women from 49 states, 26 international countries, three military organizations and three federal organizations.
