COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS
August 3, 2015**

Council met at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, August 3, 2015, in the Courtroom at 100 Mill Street in Barnesville, Georgia.

ACTION TAKEN BY COUNCIL

Mayor Banks, on behalf of the City Council, recognized Mr. Ralph Jones, 304 Redbud Drive. Mayor Banks noted that Mr. Jones, as part of the Great Day of Service, volunteered to clean and paint city fire hydrants. However, after fulfilling his commitment to the Great Day of Service, he has continued his endeavor and now has completed more than 40 hydrants around his neighborhood, not only providing the labor, but also purchasing the paint and supplies out of his own pocket. The Council unanimously thanked Mr. Jones for his community service.
