The Regular Meeting of the Gladwin City Council was held in person at the Gladwin County Road Commission board room located at 301 S. State Rd. in Gladwin, MI 48624 The meeting was called to order by Mayor Darlene Jungman at 5:00 p.m.

Mayor Jungman led the Pledge of Allegiance and Council Member Sarah Kile gave the invocation.

Approval of Minutes. Motion by Council Member Gardner, supported by Council Member Caffrey to approve the minutes of the Regular Council meeting on April 5, 2021 with the correction of the date on top reflecting the April 5, 2021 meeting date. All ayes. Motion carried.

Approval of Warrant. Motion by Council Member Gardner, supported by Council Member Caffrey to approve warrant #21-028 in the amount of \$32,885.16. All ayes. Motion carried.

Hearing of Delegations: County Commissioner Ron Taylor stated they have a new county commissioner. He is from Secord. His name is Michael Szuch and is a retired civil engineer. He is replacing Kyle Diller. This Thursday there is a meeting with the drain commission and EGLE Authority Board for the final inspection. Looking to approve and let out bids for the repair of the stairs. Council Member Kile inquired on the county administration position and the applicants. Will Karen Moore stated she will be contacting the MSU extension to help with the process? Need to determine who they will interview. County Commission Ron Taylor stated he had not heard the County will be receiving four point nine (4.9) million in COVID relief money. He was asked if the county would be re-instating the twenty-five thousand (\$25,000.00) once those dollars were received. Not this year, but will look at it yearly.

New Business:

- a.) Ordinance Amendment-1st Reading. The Council received a request for a fund raiser at North Park with a beer tent. The current ordinance does not allow alcohol at North Park. Working with the city's attorney to allow alcohol for special events and disc golf. Offensives against public order would remain in effect. Council Member Darlington commented, the

Council will still be responsible for approving. Council Member Gardner and Council Member Gardner inquired on the use of alcohol at disc golf. City Administrator Christopher Shannon stated the ordinance allows for anything to come before the council seeking approval. Council Member Kile asked why North Park was being restricted. City Administrator Christopher Shannon stated there was problems years ago which prompted the ordinance. There was a request to have Chief Killian to be at the next council meeting for the 2nd reading. City Administrator Christopher Shannon stated Chief Killian and himself had a discussion in regards to the ordinance amendment and felt good with what was presented. Mayor Darlene Jungman questioned how the city would control the drinking at disc golf. Police can do drive through of the area.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 346

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE CITY OF GLADWIN AMENDING CITY CODE ARTICLE IX CHAPTER 95. SECTION 95-12 IS HEREBY RESTATED AS FOLLOWS:

Section 95.12 Alcohol use in parks.

In general, the use of alcohol in the North Park Recreation Area is prohibited, except as follows:

- (A) The City Council, may, upon application by a responsible organization, issue a permit for events, at which alcohol is permitted or served. The issuance of permits within this subsection are with the sole discretion of City Council. City Council may adopt policies or conditions for granting permits under this section, related to insurance or any other matter, as it deems expedient from time to time.
- (B) The Parks and Recreation Commission may, by regularly adopted rule, permit or prohibit the use of alcohol in any defined area of the North Recreation Area. Rules adopted pursuant to this subsection maybe amended or rescinded by either The Parks and Recreation Commission, or City Council, with the sole discretion of either. Should the two bodies come into conflict on the rules adopted under this section, the City Council's decision shall prevail. The Parks and Recreation Commission may adopt policies or conditions for the use and possession of alcohol when permitted, as it deems expedient from time to time.

Effective Date.

This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days following date of publication as required by law. All Ordinances or part Ordinances in conflict with any of the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
