MDEQ Lead and Copper Rule Discussion

- Background – The State of Michigan, Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) has recently adopted the Lead & Copper Rule pertaining to Drinking Water Systems. This Law change took place on June 14, 2018. A statewide advisory council was formed on September 14, 2018. Legal challenges were initiated in October and an appeal has been denied. By rule the DEQ was supposed to have a Community Advisory set up in September to assist communities and the impacts. This Community Advisory was created on December 11, 2018. On January 1, 2019 the new sampling procedures were put into place.

The City has construction that will occur in 2019 and we need to develop a plan on how to handle the Lead and Copper ruling. OHM Advisors will have representatives present at a Council Workshop on January 28, 2019.

- Lead and Copper – by definition consists of either a lead service line or a galvanized service line that has a lead gooseneck connection at the water main. This lead gooseneck is typically 2-4 feet in length and is common on the City's galvanized lines.
- Prior to this rule change, during construction projects, the City of Milan would replace the water service from the new water main to the property line, connecting to a new curb stop at the property line and then reconnect the existing water service to the curb stop.
- The DEQ is requiring Municipalities to replace the service line from the water main to the residential/commercial meter within the basement or crawl space at the cost of the municipality.
