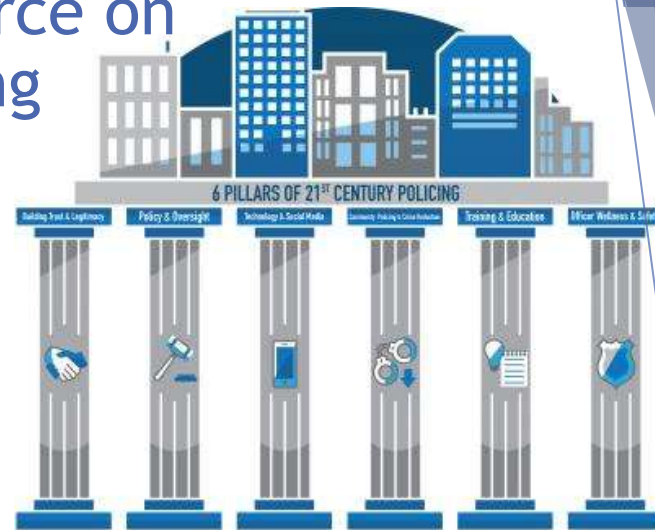

Part I Offenses

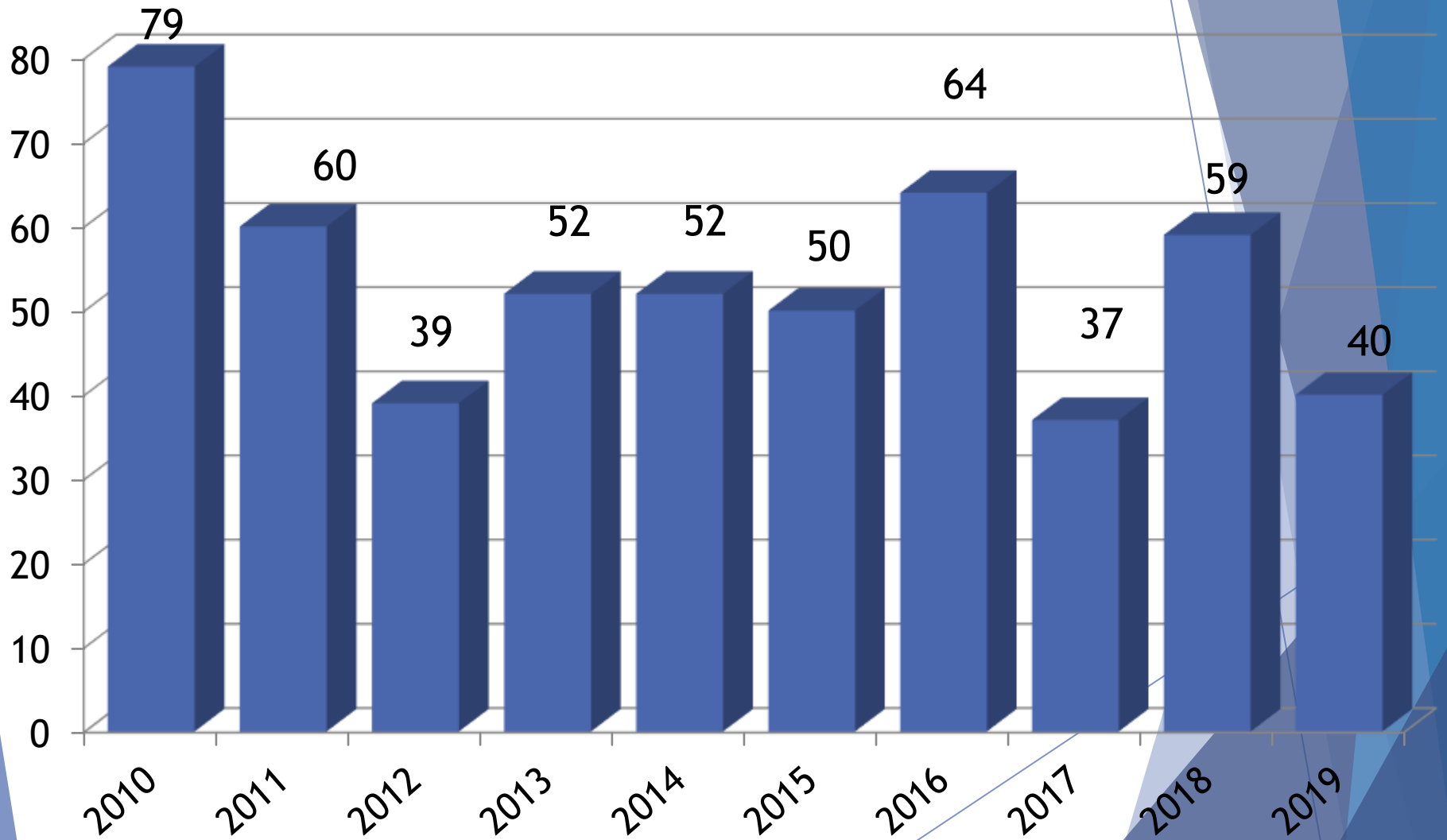
Part I Violent Crimes:

- Murder – includes manslaughter; does not include attempts.
- Rape – includes attempts.
- Robbery – includes weapons and “strong-arm.”
- Aggravated Assault – involves a weapon or serious injury.

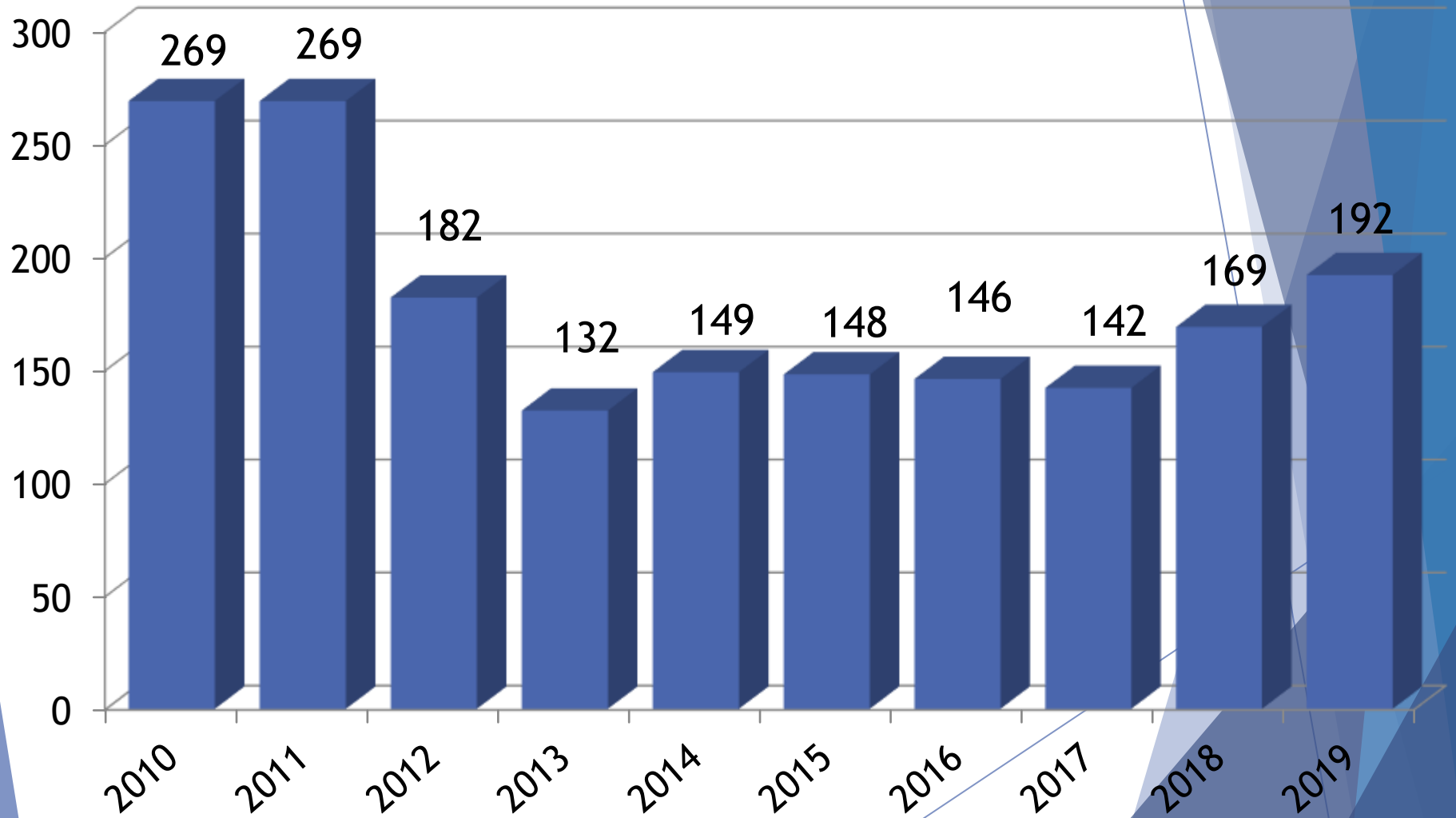
Part I Property Crimes:

- Burglary – with or without force; includes attempts.
- Larceny / Theft – except motor vehicle theft; includes attempts.
- Motor Vehicle Theft – includes attempts.
- Arson
