**Saturday Drop Off** – The next scheduled dates for drop off of bulk trash on the third Saturday of each month, from 9:00 AM – 2:00 PM, are as follows: May 18 and June 15.

**Holiday Trash Collection** – There will be no regular trash collection on Monday, May 27, 2013, in recognition of the Memorial Day holiday. The next regular trash collection will be on Thursday, May 30<sup>th</sup>.

**Field of Dreams** - The Field of Dreams is being aerated, seeded and fertilized. The Field will be closed during this process and will, weather permitting, reopen after the weekend of May 4, 2013.

**Bulk Trash Pickups & Special Trash Pickups**

Bulk Trash pickups are scheduled by **APPOINTMENT ONLY**. In order to have bulk items picked up on Wednesdays, you must call Bates Trash and Trucking Company at 301-773-2069, before 2:00 PM on Tuesdays.

Items must be at curbside by 7:00 AM on Wednesdays. Bates is not required to pick up more than **THREE (3) bulk items from any one-family dwelling per week**. If you have more than three (3) items, you can make another appointment for the items to be picked up on the following Wednesday.

The following items will not be picked up: building materials, concrete, bricks, roof shingles, stumps, bamboo, pressurized containers, explosives, paint (unless paint is dry in cans), poisons, caustics, construction and demolition debris, asbestos, toilets, free liquids, sewage, sludge. May is National Electrical Safety Month. To play it safe around your home, just remember the rules for using electricity the right way:

- **DON'T** plug a bunch of stuff into one outlet or extension cord. It could damage the electrical system in your house or even cause a fire.
- Make sure all electric cords are tucked away, neat and tidy. Pets might chew on electrical cords, and people might trip and fall.
- **DON'T** ever climb the fence around an electrical substation. If a ball or pet gets inside the fence, call the electric company - they'll come and get it out for you.
- **DON'T** yank an electrical cord from the wall. Pulling on a cord can damage the appliance, the plug or the outlet.
- Fly your kite far away from power lines or substations. The kite and the string may conduct electricity, sending it right through you to the ground.
- Children should not operate appliances which require electricity. Adults should always take the lead in assisting children with something that uses electricity.
- **DO** look up and look out for power lines before you climb a tree. The electricity can go right through the tree branch, and right through you!
- Safety covers should always be used on all unused electrical outlets. Covering outlets will also help save energy by stopping cold drafts.
- Watch out for power lines when using a ladder, chainsaw or other outdoor equipment.
- Keep electrical stuff far away from water. Most electrical accidents around the house happen when people use electricity near water.

The Riverdale Park Arts Council invites owners and drivers of vintage vehicles – cars, trucks and motorcycles – to bring their rides to the sixth annual live music and arts celebration in Town Center at the MARC train station May 5, 11 am to 5 pm. Riverdale Park’s World of Wheels is the latest addition to ArtsFest2013 and is inspired by the rave reception last year to Clarke Bedford’s art car *Vanadu*, his intriguing Gothic art barn on wheels. Within days of last year’s festival where he and his ride were the most photographed artist and work, the Hyattsville artist drove to Texas where he claimed “First Place” at the Houston Art Car Parade in the daily driver category. Clarke Bedford has again been invited to park on the Queensbury Road sidewalk again this year. And so have dozen other motoring enthusiasts. We’ve attached an application form to make free sign-ups easy.

We are also assembling a judging panel of experts who know cars, trucks and motorcycles including Joe Howard, an avid automobile enthusiast and collector who has owned numerous classic imported and domestic vehicles. The son of an auto mechanic whose parents met in 1960 at Royal Motors Chrysler-Plymouth in Washington, D.C., Joe says he owes his very existence to the automobile industry. 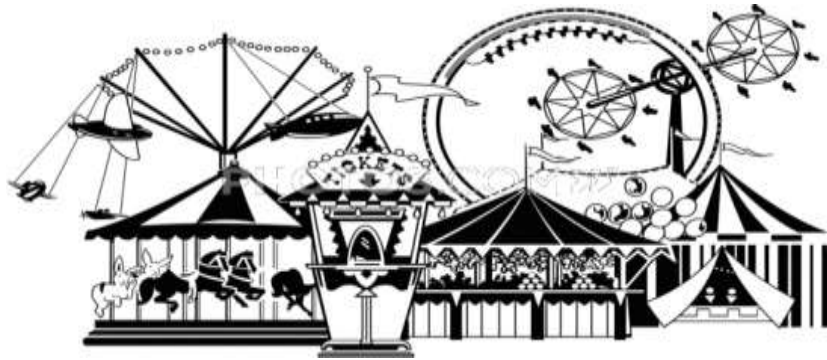

# Artists, Authors, Crafters, Vintage Vehicles@ArtsFest2013

A crowd of nearly 1,000 is expected to converge on Town Center@the MARC train station on Sunday, May 5 when the Riverdale Park Arts Council holds its sixth annual ArtsFest. The rain or shine event this year features dozens of artists, crafters, authors and food vendors along with six hours of live music beginning at 11 am. Starting off the stage bill will be the nine-member Parkdale High Jazz Ensemble followed by the Archie Edwards Blues Heritage Foundation trio featuring David Oziel on guitar, David Jackson on bass, and Howard Moss on harmonica. Riverdale Park's own jazz-infused, Americana-marinated alt-pop Brulee will perform cuts from its new CD, "To A Crisp" and electric blues-filled The Smokin' Polecats. The Rodney Kelley Jazz Experience featuring saxophonist Russell Lyles wraps a day of blues and jazz.

Dozens of artists and authors representing the community's great depth and diversity will be a part of ArtsFest2013. For instance, Hyattsville artist Delia Mychajluk, who earned a BFA at the Corcoran School of Art, focused heavily in sculpture, also earned undergraduate and graduate degrees in nursing and mental health nursing from The Catholic University of Maryland. "My art is an expression of thoughts and feelings about what I consider the "essentials" of things, i.e., life/death, growth, and the boundaries between the physical/spiritual worlds. Connections between people and animals and people and the world of nature are also explored. Some of my images come directly from dreams. I do not confine myself to a single medium and I create both two and three-dimensional pieces of art."

Ken Laureys, a longtime Riverdale Park resident got his green thumb early in life, He was raised next door to his Italian grandfather and they grew tomatoes together. He came to Washington for college and was "awed by the National Bonsai museum at the DC Arboretum." He took bonsai classes there and learned how to manage began the growing soil just right, then watering, pruning and shaping without killing the plant. He only exhibited his specimens at ArtFest2011 but was overwhelmed last year by the brisk sales last year. This year he'll introduce a selection of younger and more economical beginners' trees for sale.

"The hobby is very satisfying as you cultivate your little trees slowly but surely, season by season. Gives you a sense of the more natural rhythms beyond our fast-paced culture," says Laureys. "And, Bonsai are pretty obedient to your training instructions -- more so for sure than trying to train pets or your children -- so you feel quite gratified in creating them."

Dr. Mary Vechery, a mechanical engineer by day but a lead glass artist at night and on weekends, was also inspired by her artist grandfather. As a youngster, she learned to sew in the 4-H along with a slew of other arts and crafts. Focused for years on earning seven advanced degrees, Mary has recently returned to her soothing work as a stained glass maker using the tool and glass collection inherited from grandpa. She will be debuting at the ArtsFest with a slew of glass bottle and vase-type lamps and will consider custom orders.
