

ORDINANCE NO. 21.

ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SALE OF CERTAIN PERISHABLE FOODS WITHIN THE COUNTY OF WALLA WALLA AND PROVIDING A PENALTY.

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Walla Walla, County, Washington, all members concurring, that it shall be illegal for any person, firm or corporation to peddle, sell, offer for sale or resale in the County of Walla Walla, State of Washington perishable foods of the following general classes:

Fish, seafood, cream pies, potato salad, or other mixtures of food together with mayonnaise and/or other items similar in nature which are conducive to the rapid growth of harmful bacteria by their very nature unless he first obtains a permit from the Walla Walla County-City Health Department. Regularly approved establishments selling food items of this category may be exempt.

Permits will be granted by the Department upon compliance with the following minimum requirements.

1. All premises where such foods are sold must be kept in a sanitary manner, free from offensive odors, adequately screened or flies absent.
2. It must have adequate clean storage and refrigeration.
3. Handwashing and toilet facilities.
4. Hot and cold running water.
5. Sewerage connections.
6. Adequate covered garbage and trash containers.

Penalties:

Any person violating any provisions of this resolution shall, upon conviction thereof, be adjudged guilty of a misdemeanor and fined in a sum not exceeding one hundred (\$100.) dollars, or imprisoned in the county jail for a period not exceeding thirty days, or both so fined and imprisoned. Each and every violation of the provisions of the ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.
